What happens when someone reports possible child abuse or maltreatment?

Allegation Referral

A report of possible child maltreatment is made to the Child Welfare Agency. If the allegation is screened in*, an investigation commences.



Investigation¹

45-day long investigation of the allegation circumstances by the Child Welfare Agency.

Social worker will work with the family:

- · Family & community interviews
- · Home visits

For the safety of the child, the **child may be moved to a different household** such as with family, a foster family or group home. It is the hope that the family can reunite after additional steps.




Latin American Children in Investigations

Latin American children and families are over-represented in the Child Welfare System in Ontario



"Over-represented" means that the **proportion** of Latin American children aged 0-15 that were involved in Child Welfare Investigations in Ontario in 2018 (2.8%) is **higher than the proportion** of Latin American children aged 0-15 living in Ontario in 2018 (1.3%).



Ontario Child Population 2018 (0-15 Years)



The rate of investigations involving Latin American children is **2.3x higher** than that for white children.

Latin American Children in Investigations



Allegations* of child maltreatment were most often made by police in investigations involving Latin American children.



Family violence was a concern in 44% of investigations by child welfare agencies involving Latin American children.









Child Welfare Investigations involving Latin American Children in Ontario in 2018



Latin American children involved in investigations were older and had fewer functioning concerns.












Child Functioning Concerns

21% of Investigations in Latin American children involved at least one child functioning concern.

79% None

39% of Investigations in White children involved at least one child functioning concern.

61% None






Caregiver Characteristics

Caregivers in Latin American families were less likely to have risk factors than caregivers in White families.








1 in 5 caregivers moved to Canada in the last 5 years in investigations involving Latin American children

Frequent moves | Home overcrowded | Unsafe Housing




